### A Busy Time of Year

We are grateful for the ongoing efforts of our VISTA members and site supervisors to address the needs of Cache Valley and the surrounding area. ## SITE HIGHLIGHTS

### Look at What Our VISTAs Have Been Up To Title VII of Northern Utah

Title VII is a national program that ensures the academic success of Native American students in the public school system. We currently have 4 VISTA members working at the local Title VII office, which services Cache and Box Elder counties. Their primary goals are serve as mentors, promote college and career readiness, increase communication between parents and school staff, and to spread cultural awareness.

November marked the celebration of National Native Heritage Month, and our Title VII VISTA Members made sure to spread awareness wherever possible. Angelina Whitehorse prepared a surprise presentation of Native Powwow singers and dancers at Mountain Crest High School to increase awareness of cultural sensitivity. After the event, many students commented how much they enjoyed the presentation and how it helped them to better understand their Native classmates. Corrie Bicakcioglu was please to reintroduce the Title VII program at Heritage Elementary.

She also helped Native elementary students connect with their culture by drawing pictures representing their tribes; these pictures will be compiled into a booklet that will be given to Native Students to share with their families. Cameron Brewer facilitated career and college exploration with high school students through events like Native Aggie Day on Utah State University's campus and by assisting seniors with university and FAFSA applications. For Native Heritage month Cameron worked with Native students to create posters explaining aspects of indigenous culture to their non-Native peers. Jennie Hymas worked with students in the elementary and middle schools she serves to create projects celebrating the students' tribes. These projects were well received by school staff and parents alike and many offered additional support. Reviewing all these accomplishments, it looks like National Native Heritage month was a success in our schools. Thanks for making this possible Title VII team!

## Family Information & Resource Center

The Family Information & Resource Center is a local organization whose goal is to strengthen families and promote their success. They accomplish this by hosting parenting classes, providing home visits, maintaining a children's resource library, and connecting families to needed services.

Laura Higgins has recently helped to implement a new data system at her site, which keeps track of the large number of volunteers she receives on a daily basis. With this new data she will be better able to manage her volunteers and optimize their time. She has also improved the Center's classes with new lesson plans and increased volunteer training. Since the changes have been made, parents of children who attend the Center's classes have remarked that their children are learning many more skills that they can apply in the home. 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### Wilson Elementary School

Michelle Dove and Lynda Jensen, both recent VISTA alumni, collected gently used clothes throughout the school year for the annual Wilson Closet Clothing Drive, which serves students and local community members. Students, teachers, parents, and other community members donated over \$2,600 worth of clothes, shoes, backpacks, and outerwear for the event. In addition to these donations, Michelle and Lynda recruited 93 volunteers for this event, who put in a total of 564 hours of volunteer work. Thanks to the Wilson Closet, clothing was provided to 268 people. Awesome job Wilson crew!

### Willow Valley Middle School

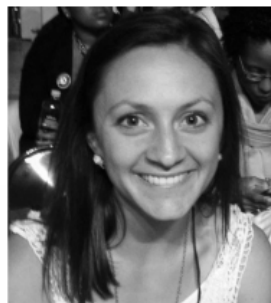
